

ANIRAV POOL RULES

These rules apply to all visitors, including members, guests, swim team (home & visitor), and day cares. Lifeguards are authorized to enforce all pool rules and maintain safety, including taking actions not specifically listed in the rules below, if necessary. All patrons must follow lifeguard instructions at all times. Failure to comply may result in immediate removal from the pool area and potential suspension of pool privileges.

- **NO RUNNING.**
- Smoking/Vaping is allowed only in the designated smoking area (back right corner behind pool fence). Marijuana in any form is strictly prohibited.
- Proper swimwear is required. Overly revealing suits and mermaid tails are not permitted. Monofins may only be used by adults in the lap lane for exercise. Water shoes are allowed in the pool. River/lake shoes are allowed. However, if any water shoe restricts an individual's ability to swim safely, they will be asked to remove them. Please ensure shoes are clean and free of dirt before entering the pool.
- No oversized floats. Lifeguards have final authority to approve or deny any float for safety reasons.
- No disposable diapers in the pool. Only swim diapers or rubber pants over cloth diapers are permitted.
- Do not enter the pool with contagious illnesses or open wounds. Lifeguards may deny entry for health concerns.
- All swimmers must be free of oil, dirt, sweat, grease etc. and must remove all bandages prior to entering the pool. Showers are provided.
- Eating and drinking are not permitted at the pool's edge, or in the pool. Glass containers and breakable food containers are not allowed.
- Changing tables are located in both bathrooms and should be used for all diaper changes.
- Guard break occurs 15 minutes before every hour. All swimmers under 18 years of age must exit the pool during this time.
- Children under the age of 6 may use the baby pool with constant supervision by an adult or babysitter (15+)
 - Babysitters 15 - 16 years old should have a Red Cross Babysitter course certificate. Babysitters 17 years old and older do not need a certification from the Red Cross. Lifeguards reserve the right to ask for a copy of this certification if the babysitter is younger than 17 years old.
- Children 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult while at the pool.
- Report all accidents to the lifeguard immediately. An incident report must be completed and signed.
- No pets allowed in the pool area. Animals must not be left in vehicles (Animal Control will be contacted).
- Use only Anirav's driveway and main gate for pool access. No trespassing on neighbors property.
- Disrespectful behavior (ex. profanity, bullying, harassment) will not be tolerated.
- **5 MPH is the speed limit in the parking lot and driveway.**
- All trash must be disposed of in provided receptacles.
- No alcohol or drugs permitted.
- No climbing on tables, structures and/or fences.
- There is to be no unauthorized swimming in the well; please gain permission from the lifeguards prior to swimming in the well.
- Guests need to be signed in with their accompanying member. Guest fees or guest passes must be used for all guests. Guests under the age of 2 are free. Guests from

more than 100 miles may visit the pool for free (up to 1 week). Grandparents are always free while at the pool with a member. Members who wish to bring 10 or more guests on the same day may be subject to additional fees.

Swim Test Policy

- Swim tests may be administered at any time at the discretion of lifeguards or pool management.
- Swim Tests are used to assess a swimmer's ability to safely use specific areas of the pool, including the diving well and deep end.
- A swim test may be requested based on observed ability to swim, or rescues.
- Lifeguards and management have the final authority to require or deny access based on swim ability.
- Failure to comply with a swim test request will result in restricted access to deeper areas of the pool.

Lap Lane Policy

- The lap lane must remain clear for lap swimmers at all times.

Flotation Devices

- Flotation devices being utilized as a swim aid must be Coast Guard certified.
- Anyone using a flotation device as a swim aid must be within arm's reach of a proficient swimmer (parent or guardian).
- All other floats (inner tubes, pool noodles, kickboards etc.) being used for leisure purposes are allowed. Floats for leisure should be single seater floats and not prevent the lifeguards ability to see other swimmers. Any floats or individuals using floats in a disruptive manner will be asked to exit the pool.

DIVING BOARD RULES

OFF THE SIDE OF THE POOL:

- No can openers
- No jumping backwards
- No inward flips
- No seat busters
- No flips (front or back)
- No diving at the 4 ft end of the pool

OFF BOTH HIGH AND LOW DIVING BOARDS:

- No wearing goggles
- No wearing flotation devices
- No jumping backwards
- No cutaways or gainers
- No back flips
- No sitting on the board
- No bouncing more than once
- No hanging on rails
- No diving off sides
- No eating or drinking
- No throwing head towards the board
- No hesitating before diving
- No swimming under the rope
- No running on/off the boards
- No seat busters
- No intentionally splashing the lifeguards

- Swim straight toward the side & exit the pool promptly
- Individuals going off of the diving board must be able to swim, no one is able to wait at the end of the diving board to catch the individual.
- No back dives
- Climb ladder safely
- Do not climb on the ladder until the person in front of you has left the board (keep both feet on the cement)
- Do not jump or dive from the board until the person in front of you has reached the ladder.
- If you are unable to go off the board, a parent must assist the child in going down the board ladder. That person is no longer able to use the diving board for that day.
- Lifeguards and Management decisions are final.

DAY CARE RULES

- Sit only at the specified Day Care assigned tables. They must take care to clean up after themselves.
- All Day Care children swimming in the 4 feet or over must pass a swim test on the first visit and each time thereafter wear something to indicate their level of swimming abilities.
- Day Care providers must either be in the pool or sit in designated chairs posted around the pool perimeter, effectively serving as additional supervision for their children. These providers must supervise their children.
- All pool rules must be followed by all Day Care Children. This will be enforced by the Day Care providers and Lifeguards.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Violation of any of the previous pool rules will result in disciplinary action.

- Disciplinary Action is as follows:
 - First offense will result in a verbal warning
 - Subsequent offense consequences will be determined by the lifeguards and/or pool board depending on the severity of the offense. If the offender is a minor, parent/guardian will be notified.
 - Members are responsible for their guests and may be subject to disciplinary action if their guest violates pool rules
 - Anirav pool board reserves the right to revoke pool membership without refund in relation to violation of pool rules. The pool board may revoke pool membership without refund without verbal warning based on severity of offense.
 - If removal from the pool property is necessary the Lifeguards and/or pool board has the authority to notify the proper law enforcement agency.
